Fireweed has been recently located in the ACT and also on the Monaro Highway near the border. Fireweed is a serious pasture weed of coastal New South Wales. It is able to grow on most soil types and in all aspects.

It forms a persistent seed bank if not controlled, before it flowers and can rapidly take over heavily grazed and neglected pastures and roadsides, competing strongly with existing plants. It seeds prolifically and grows to maturity quickly. Fireweed can quickly establish.
