6. Membership Report

Warren reported that our current membership increased by 1 to 109. The number of people who have requested to be on the email lists increased by 2 to 230, making the total number of people on the lists 339.

7. Weed Management

Weeding effort in the 3 months since the last meeting (February to April) was 282 hours, 8% more than for the same 3 months last season but 19% below average for those three months for the previous 12 seasons. The largest proportion of effort (35%) was spent on Miscellaneous broadleaf weeds (much of it on Fleabane) followed by St. John's Wort (28%), Briars, Blackberries and other Woody weeds (16%), Spear and other thistles (15%) and African lovegrass (4%).

The season has seen outbreaks of blackberries and woody weed seedlings. Efforts to control St John's Wort and Verbascum have paid off, with lessened intensity of these weeds in the reserve.

A summary of weed control <u>effort for the first nine months of the 2022-2023 season</u> is available on the website.

8. Information and Outreach

a. Website

There have been no significant additions to the website in the last 3 months. The number of unique visitors in the 3 months since February 1st has averaged 182, the long-term average for the last few years and 6% down on the previous 3 months (November—January). Interest in walking pages was nearly double that for the previous 3 months and is 1.3 times the pre-Covid level; most of this increase was in April, a holiday-filled month.

Since the species numbers were tallied for the February Update we have added 7 new native and 21 new native species, including 7 plant species, to bring the total to 914.

The fotpin Facebook page has 481 followers, and the Instagram account has 141 followers.

Ground Cover Revegetation Quarterly Update

Direct Seeding

Fenced Site 3

The spraying of sorrel seedlings (refer February update 2023) was successful and the microlaena seedlings survived. However the sorrel seed bank is obviously much larger than the number of microlaena seeds we introduced, so in April all the gum leaves were removed from the site to uncover and spray all new sorrel seedling. There were areas where our sowing was not as successful as we would have liked, particularly in the area previously covered by Yorkshire fog as the soil there had more clay content and the soil was too wet to work to get the microlaena seeds at the optimum soil depth. To avoid disturbing the soil too much and to enhance conditions for sorrel seeds we made single narrow furrows and sowed the microlaena in these furrows. The leaves we removed from site were used to put a thick layer of mulch over nearby patches of nearby sorrel outside the fence. Whilst this has proved successful in other areas where we have done this we would still like to know how long it takes to ensure that the rhizomes are killed.

Fenced Site 1

This site has proven to be very difficult to get microlaena to successfully seed. We have found that area not covered by native vegetation is shallow because of underground rocks. With remaining money from the grant for Site 3 we purchased rough spear grass Austrostipa scabra seeds. In April some of these were sown in this area.

New Unfenced Site.

Just to the south of Fenced Site 3 there was a gentle slope fairly devoid of vegetation the upper portion of which looked like it was slightly prone to sheet erosion. The soil was hard and dry, we have raked leaves into contoured strips to slow water flow and perhaps get better moisture penetration before we sowed microlaena and a few spear grass seeds.

The site has now been protected with dead branches to protect it from trampling (compressing the soil which makes it harder for seeds to emerge) and grazing when any seedlings emerge, none have emerged to date.

Survey on Planted Forbs

A survey done this week all of the forbs we have planted in separate guards (not in fenced areas) reveals a 77% success rate of survival to date. Success depended upon the area it was planted in with the worst area giving only 64% survival and the best 85% with recruitment in this better area outnumbering failures by over 2 to 1.
